



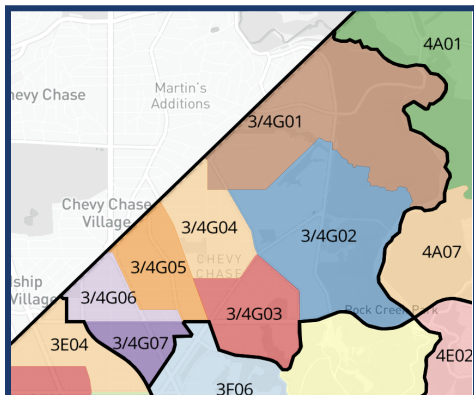

I. Overview

Advisory Neighborhood Commission 3/4G represents the neighborhoods of Chevy Chase D.C., Barnaby Woods, and Hawthorne across parts of Wards 3 and 4. ANC 3/4G contains seven Single Member Districts (SMDs) and about 15,000 people. It holds regular meetings and works with District agencies to represent constituents and advise the city government on key issues.

III. Major Issues

Major issues considered by the Commission in 2023 included:

Civic Core- The Commission urged the Office of Planning and DMPED to receive and consider the ANC's community survey before advancing plans to redevelop the Civic Core or change zoning. The Commission stated that surplusing public property at this time was not appropriate and urged DMPED/ OP to use robust community engagement with visuals produced by ARCGIS modeling software to illustrate proposed changes. The Commission worked on a survey to be distributed in fall of 2023, with the goal of using the survey results to inform its own decision making and give feedback to the city in the Civic Core redevelopment process.

Maret Field - The Commission dissolved the Memorandum of Understanding that it had made with the Maret School regarding design, construction and operation of a sports field on the grounds of the Episcopal Center for Children. This followed a ruling from the Office of the Attorney General stating that the MOU was not valid.

X. Explanation of Late Submission

I do apologize that the FY2023 Annual Report for ANC 3/4G was not submitted by the November 30, 2023, deadline. I was elected Chair in January 2026. When I discovered that no annual reports seemed to have been filed for FY2023, 2024, or for FY2025 as statutorily required, I first attempted to determine if the ANC3/4G FY2023 Annual Report existed but somehow had not been filed appropriately with the OANC and city. Although I found that then-Chair Gore had put the annual report on the draft agenda for the January 8, 2024 public meeting, according to the minutes, the FY2023 report was not presented or approved on January 8, 2024. Minutes of the January 22, 2024, public meeting indicated that the FY2023 annual report was still in progress. An email from OANC Executive Director Kent Boese on January 24, 2025, indicated he had still not received the FY2023 report. In April and May, I asked the previous Chair if she had drafts she could share, but I received no response. I reached out to our Commission on May 17, 2026, advising them that I was writing the missing report using publicly available information, asking for contributions and giving a sample of what I'd done for the 2025 report. Again, receiving no contribution or comment from the previous Chair, I completed the FY2023 Annual Report. Documentation of my efforts to locate a missing report and include comments [is here](#).
